Frequently Asked Questions

When will Madrasah re-open?

Madrasah will re-open in September with full attendance; the start dates for different [year groups can be found here](#).

Will there be different entrances and exits for different classes?

Yes, it is extremely important parents know which entrance and exit to use. [This can be found here](#).

Will the start and finish time be staggered for different year groups?

Madrasah doors will open at 4.40pm for all children, Pupils should be settled in class by 5pm. Finish times will be different for each year group, [this can be found here](#). Please ensure that pupils are dropped off/collected promptly at the staggered times provided in the table.

Will parents be allowed in the Madrasah?

No, parents and visitors will not be permitted to enter the building. Communication should be made via email or telephone.

Is the Madrasah safe for reopening?

We have been working tirelessly to ensure we can reopen safely for the wellbeing of our pupils. A detailed risk assessment has been carried out in consultation with authorities and health experts. [You can find the risk assessment on our website](#).

Will the Madrasah implement a bubble system?

Yes, each class will be considered a 'bubble'.

Will the toilets and ablution facilities be open for use?

Yes, however we strongly advise parents to ensure your child has visited the toilet before attending the Madrasah. Ablution facilities will be restricted.

Will there be any hygiene requirements?

Yes, there will be a hand sanitiser on each entrance/exit and on individual floors. We will be promoting 'catch it, bin it, kill it' and will appreciate parental support in this matter.

What happens if my child becomes ill in Madrasah?

Any children who fall ill or develop symptoms in Madrasah will go home. Our Covid officer will be in regular contact to advise and take appropriate action.

Will there be remote learning if my child is in isolation?

Yes, we will try our best to ensure the impact on education is limited due to isolation.

Will the Madrasah close if a positive case is identified?

In most cases closure of the Madrasah will not be needed, but this will be a decision based on various factors such as the risk of further spread, operational issues and advice from public health.

What should a parent or child who has symptoms or been in contact with someone who has covid do?

Parents are strongly advised to read government guidelines on what to do if someone develops symptoms or has been in contact with a person who has Covid. In addition, you should notify the Madrasah so appropriate action can be taken.

Will the Madrasah notify all parents if a positive case has been identified in the Madrasah?

No, only the relevant individuals will be notified in line with government guidelines. (updated 20/08/2020)
